

Hurricane Irma NATCA is here to help you

Hurricane Irma has already caused damage throughout the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico. It is set to hit Florida this weekend and possibly Georgia, South Carolina, and/or North Carolina coastlines in the next few days.

NATCA has 110 members in its six Caribbean facilities. Federal Aviation Administration facilities San Juan CERAP (ZSU), San Juan Tower (SJU), and St. Thomas (STT), and Federal Contract Towers at St. Croix (STX), Aguadilla Tower (BQN), and Isla Grande Tower (SIG). ZSU FacRep Woody Camp says all members there are accounted for. The facility is running on generators. Long range radar and weather radar is out. They've not yet been able to reach STT airport via satellite phone. While Puerto Rico was spared a direct eyewall hit, the storm was still extremely powerful and knocked out power and water. "It looks like a bomb went off outside," Camp said.

Proceeds from both fundraisers will go to Houston Food Bank and ShelterBox USA - local charities supporting the Hurricane Harvey Fund.



Survey is voluntary and all responses are anonymous

The Air Traffic Organization (ATO)'s Safety and Technical Training group (AJI) is assessing the effectiveness of awareness campaign materials related to IFR/VFR conflicts. They are surveying opinions on how IFR and VFR traffic is handled. ATO's goal is to record baseline information on the current culture, attitudes, and behaviors related to managing potential IFR/VFR conflicts. The plan is to conduct a follow-up survey in about a year and assess changes in attitudes or behavior related to IFR/VFR conflicts. *Take the survey*.
