HURRICANE FLORENCE: NATCA BROTHERS & SISTERS IN NEED IN CAROLINAS & VIRGINIA, YOU CAN HELP!



NATCA members from Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, N.C. (NKT), went out to survey the damage and helped people in their community during and after the storm hit. NKT is located in the heart of some of the hardest-hit areas, between New Bern and Morehead City.

A tree fell through the house of a neighbor of Bonilla. He and Zobel helped evacuate the family to Zobel's house.



The next day, Bonilla and Zobel secured the neighbor's home and checked on the surrounding neighborhood to ensure everyone was OK and gauge their food and water situation.

While rain and wind from Hurricane Florence have finally ended, the waters from the storm have not yet receded in the affected parts of the Carolinas and Virginia. Severe flooding continues to threaten the safety and property of residents there. NATCA's Southern Regional Vice President Jim Marinitti said thankfully, all members are accounted for and safe.

According to Marinitti, in addition to recovery and relief, current challenges include addressing equipment issues at facilities like Wilmington (ILM). There, water intrusion has knocked out the use of the TRACON and members are only working out of the tower cab. Washington Center controllers are currently providing TRACON service to ILM. Marinitti added that the good news is Raleigh-Durham (RDU), Fayetteville (FAY), and Charleston (CHS) are all back to running normal operations.

Three controllers who live close by ILM were at the facility working after the storm. But the flooding cut off access to the area for all other controllers that previously evacuated. The FAA provided the use of one of its aircraft to pick up ILM members who evacuated to Raleigh-Durham, Charlotte, and Myrtle Beach, and flew them back to ILM along with supplies. "Coordination with the Agency has been fantastic," Marinitti said. "We've held regular telcons to ensure nothing was getting missed."

Marinitti reported that most of the affected members have not yet been able to return to their homes. Some NATCA members who have been able to return to their homes, have found severe flooding and devastation from the storm.

Our brothers in the Cherry Point, N.C. area, shared the above photos of the devastation affecting their neighbors. NATCA has also heard that some members in the Wilmington, N.C. area have been affected. NATCA will continue to share news about our members in these areas as it comes in.

NATCA has activated its Disaster Relief Fund to assist members who may be affected by Hurricane Florence and also Typhoon Mangkhut, which has struck Guam. This fund aids NATCA members who have experienced catastrophic

losses of property and helps provide a lifeline during those most desperate times. NATCA will work directly with the affected members to help them purchase food, gasoline, and any other supplies that might be required. We will have volunteers ready to deliver supplies as soon as we know the need.

On April 27, 2017, the pilot of a single-engine Mooney M20E was taxiing out to Runway 30 Right for departure at Rocky Mountain Metropolitan Airport (BJC).

During the morning shift on Saturday, Jan. 21, 2017, there were many factors that contributed to a very complex situation at Salt Lake City International Airport (SLC). There were snowstorms in the terminal area, and because of the snow accumulation, there were times that all runways were closed. The snow also reduced visibility to less than one mile and Runway Visual Range (RVR) advisories were being issued to a ircraft on takeoff and landing. Aircraft were involved in deicing operations.

At 12:10 p.m., Runway 35 reopened after a five-hour closure. Shortly thereafter, SkyWest Flight 5843 (SKW5843) called out of the Lima de-icing pad and taxied to Runway 35 for departure. At the time, the runway was not visible from the tower. Read more
