On Tuesday, Nov. 7, NATCA will host a reception in Washington, D.C. that will bring together members of the National Executive Board and aviation industry leaders. This inaugural event will offer an invaluable opportunity for our Union to have open and constructive conversations with industry decision-makers.

Our profession and the entire aviation industry have been through some turbulent times in recent years. Air traffic controller staffing shortages, stalled modernization of critical systems, and delays in fixing and upgrading infrastructure at facilities throughout the National Airspace System (NAS) have become part of the



public discourse as they have been identified as some of the key causes of flight delays and cancellations.

The solutions to these complex problems must be championed by the entire aviation system. We must coordinate together as a community – labor and industry – to advocate for the necessary investments in staffing and infrastructure that are necessary to not only maintain the current safety and efficiency of our current NAS, but also prepare the NAS for even greater traffic in the future. Together, this community can make a difference in the halls of Congress where many of these decisions will be made.

This reception, while informal in nature, is where relationships will be built, maintained, and grown. And while we may not agree on every issue, we can find common ground with aviation industry leaders. It is on that common ground that both NATCA and the aviation industry can speak with one voice to enact real change and build a stronger future for air traffic controllers, other aviation safety professionals, and other components of the aviation industry.
