


#### NATCA CFS 2023 Awards Luncheon



The Helping Heart Award, bestowed by NATCA's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Committee, recognizes facilities with 15 or more employees that have achieved the highest percentage of trained individuals in the use of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). Timely defibrillation is crucial in cases of sudden cardiac arrest, as each passing minute without intervention reduces the chances of survival by 7-10 percent. Proper training in AED usage significantly enhances the prospects of survival in such emergencies.
