The training was facilitated by Director of Public Affairs Thom Metzger, Deputy Director of Public Affairs Galen Munroe, and Senior Social Media Representative Meagan Roper. During the training, NATCA President Rich Santa spoke to the class members, offering updates on NATCA national activities and thanking them for their dedication and participation.

The training incorporated lessons on engaging with the media, strategies for effective interviews, and best practices for representing NATCA and aviation safety professions. Participants engaged in classroom-based learning and practical exercises in a professional television studio setting.
