


From the Desk of President Rich Santa: Shutdown Update

On Sept. 30 Congress came together in the eleventh hour to pass a bipartisan Continuing Resolution (CR) that was signed by President Joe Biden, averting a shutdown and funding the government through Nov 17, 2023. The CR also extended the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) authorization through Dec. 31, 2023.



With the passage of the CR, the threat of a government shutdown

was temporarily delayed, however, nothing changes until Congress passes fullyear appropriations legislation and long-term FAA reauthorization.

Over the past two weeks we have all witnessed the ongoing drama unfold in the U.S. House of Representatives. As internal politics in the House continues to prevent the passage of any legislation, the future remains uncertain for the aviation professionals represented by NATCA and the entire aviation industry.

I want to assure every member that their Union is proactively working and advocating on their behalf during this uncertain time. As we approach the expiration of the CR, the National Executive Board, our national staff, and the National Legislative Committee are working together to educate legislators on the need to pass long-term funding and authorization.

I have personally met with key leaders in Congress this past week, and I have made it clear that when a new speaker is elected, there should be no further delay in passing appropriations and FAA reauthorization.

NATCA members and their families deserve better than another prolonged and damaging government shutdown.
