

The NAPC is an ad hoc committee responsible to the National Executive Board (NEB) and works at the direction of the NATCA Safety & Technology Leadership Council (NSTLC).

The purpose of the Committee is to serve as the union's focal point regarding all aspects of airspace initiatives; including development, amendment, and implementation of air traffic and instrument flight procedures and airspace within the National Airspace System.

Roles and responsibilities of the NAPC include addressing airspace and procedure related issues presented by Article 114 Representatives/Co-Leads and determine those issues that require elevation to NSTLC for further action, and; advising the NSTLC of airspace and procedure related issues that may affect bargaining unit members.

The Committee is chaired by the National Airspace Representative and vice-chaired by the Deputy Director of Safety and Technology.

The NAPC committee must meet, at a minimum, monthly via remotely and/or in-person.
