## Getting Ready for Convention? Brush Up on Robert's Rules of Order

Robert's Rules of Order will guide how we deliberate and debate during NATCA's 20th Biennial Convention, May 9–11, 2025, in San Francisco.

We use these rules to ensure every member has a fair and equal opportunity to participate. They help us stay organized, focused, and respectful — even when discussing complex or contentious issues.

## 10 QUICK TIPS FOR USING ROBERT'S RULES

1. Wait to be recognized before speaking.
2. Address all remarks to the Chair, not other members.
3. Only **one motion** can be on the floor at a time.
4. Speak for or against a motion. **Stay on topic.**
5. Use "I move to..." when making a motion.
6. **Second** a motion to show it's worth discussing.
7. Ask for clarification with "Point of Information."
8. Correct a mistake with "Point of Order."
9. Vote when called, the **majority** rules.
10. **Respect** others' right to speak, even if you disagree.



Robert's Rules give structure to our discussions so we can make clear decisions that reflect the will of the membership. Whether you're new to parliamentary procedure or just want a refresher, now's a great time to get familiar and be ready to engage.

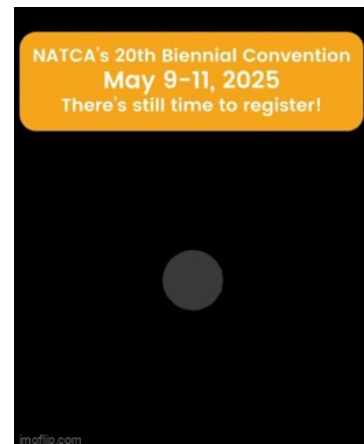
