Length of Service Increase

This pay period, NATCA represented employees will receive the negotiated length of service increase to pay. Each of NATCA's Collective Bargaining Agreements (CBAs) with the FAA provides for a one-point-six percent (1.6%) length of service increase effective the first full pay period of June. This year, the first full pay period of June concluded on June 14, so the increase will be included in the paycheck for the period of June 1-14, 2025, payable the week of June 22.



In accordance with our CBAs, if the length of service adjustment will cause the employee's Basic Pay to exceed the band maximum or the employee's Basic Pay is already equal to or exceeds the band maximum, the employee will receive a pay increase up to the band maximum and the remainder as a lump sum payment.
